Dear Mr. Kulak:

On December 23, 2024, the PECO Electric Company (PECO) submitted a compliance filing of PECO's proposed form solar PPA and the associated Request for Proposals for its long-term solar procurement ("Solar RFP") attached as Exhibit A for Commission review and approval.

This filing was submitted in accordance with PECO's Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission) approved Default Service Plan VI for the period of June 1, 2025, to May 31, 2029, as modified by the Joint Petition for Approval of Non-Unanimous Settlement, Order entered November 7, 2024.

PECO requests that the Commission approve the Solar PPA and Solar RFP process and documents.

In response to the filing, the Commission received joint comments from POWER Interfaith ("POWER"), Vote Solar, Clean Air Council, Sierra Club, Physicians for Social Responsibility, and PennEnvironment (collectively, the "Energy Justice Advocates" or "EJA"). The commenters did not oppose the Commission's approval of the Solar PPA and RFP documents filed by PECO.

The Commission did not receive any reply comments.

At this point, further investigation seems unnecessary as the compliance filing was completed consistent with the November 7, 2024, Order at Docket No. P-2024-3046008. Therefore, we approve the Solar PPA and RFP process and documents filed by PECO on December 23, 2024.
